COVID-19 Daily State Situation Report

Daily summary for 30 March 2021 (7:00 am).

Situation Report No. 420.

Today's COVID Numbers

0 New cases	A total of 20,484 cases of COVID-19 have been reported in Victoria since 1 January 2020, unchanged from yesterday. There were 0 cases notified to the department in the past 24 hours. This includes 0 locally acquired and 0 overseas acquired.
32 Days since last locally acquired case	It has been 32 days since the last locally acquired case was diagnosed.
6,045 Vaccine doses administered	There were 6,045 doses administered since yesterday's report. This contributes to a total of 92,765 vaccine doses that have been administered since 22 February 2021 by the Victorian Government in support of the Commonwealth's COVID-19 vaccine roll-out.
0 New deaths	There has been a total of 820 deaths identified among the confirmed COVID-19 cases, unchanged from yesterday.
1 Active case	There is currently 1 active case in Victoria. This includes 0 locally acquired cases (unchanged from yesterday) and 1 overseas acquired case (unchanged from yesterday). There is 1 case in hotel quarantine (which includes 0 locally acquired cases).
0 Possible cases - under review	There are currently 0 possible cases under review.
0 Patients in hospital	There are 0 people in hospital. This includes 0 in ICU, and 0 on a ventilator.
0 Active cases in healthcare workers (excluding overseas acquired cases)	There are 0 active cases in healthcare workers (excluding overseas acquired cases). To date there have been a total of 3,563 confirmed cases in healthcare workers.
37 Close contacts	There are 37 close contacts in total, with 36 being managed as primary close contacts and 1 being managed as secondary close contacts.
12,892 Tests	There were 12,892 tests received since yesterday's report. This contributes to a total of 5,395,676 COVID-19 tests that have been performed since 1 January 2020.
0 Cases under investigation	The total number of confirmed cases with mode of acquisition under investigation is 0.
Outbreaks	There are 11,222 cases that have been linked to known outbreaks. Of these outbreaks, 0 new cases have been diagnosed in the past 24 hours. There are 0 outbreaks that are linked to 0 active cases.

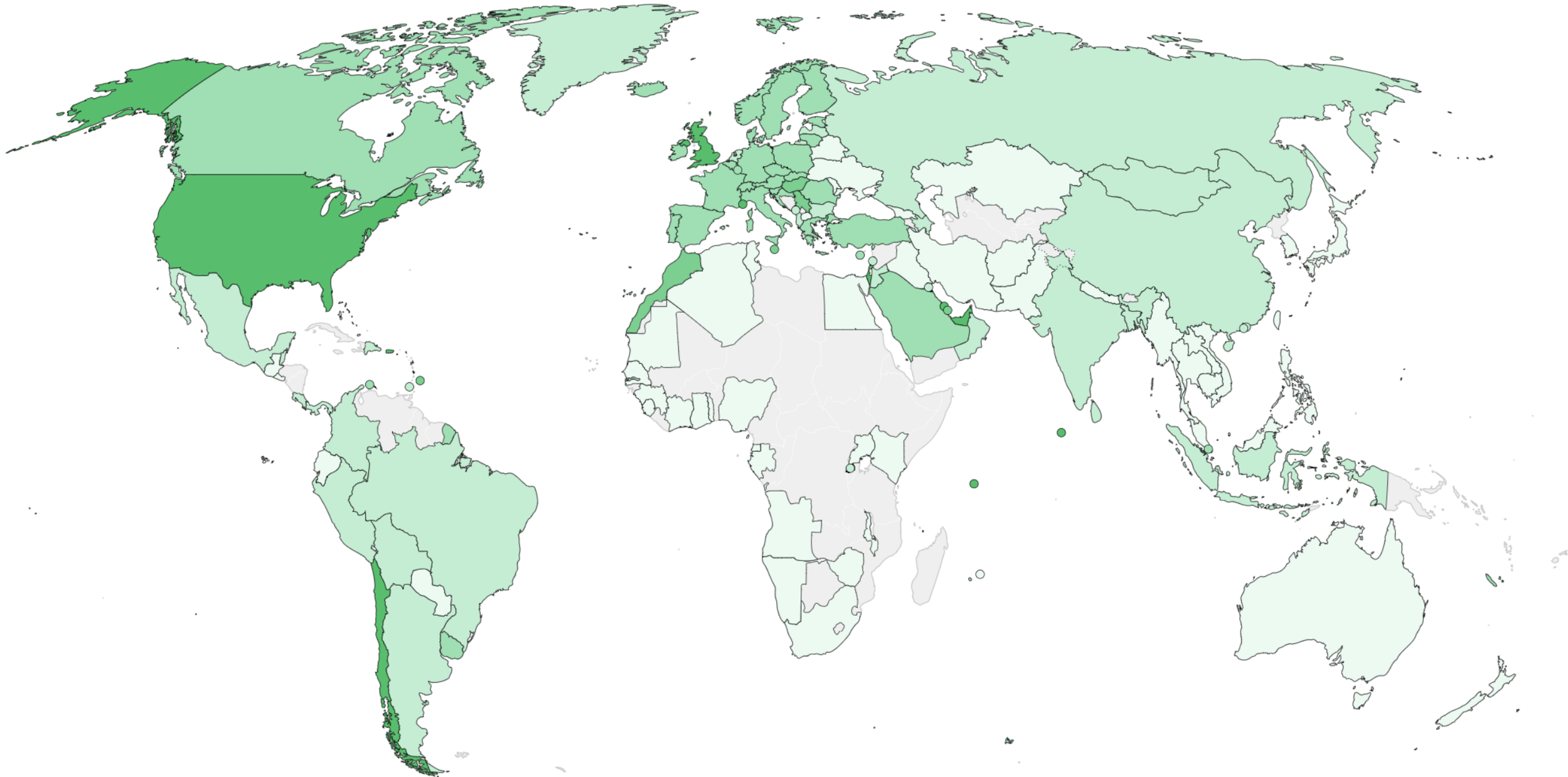

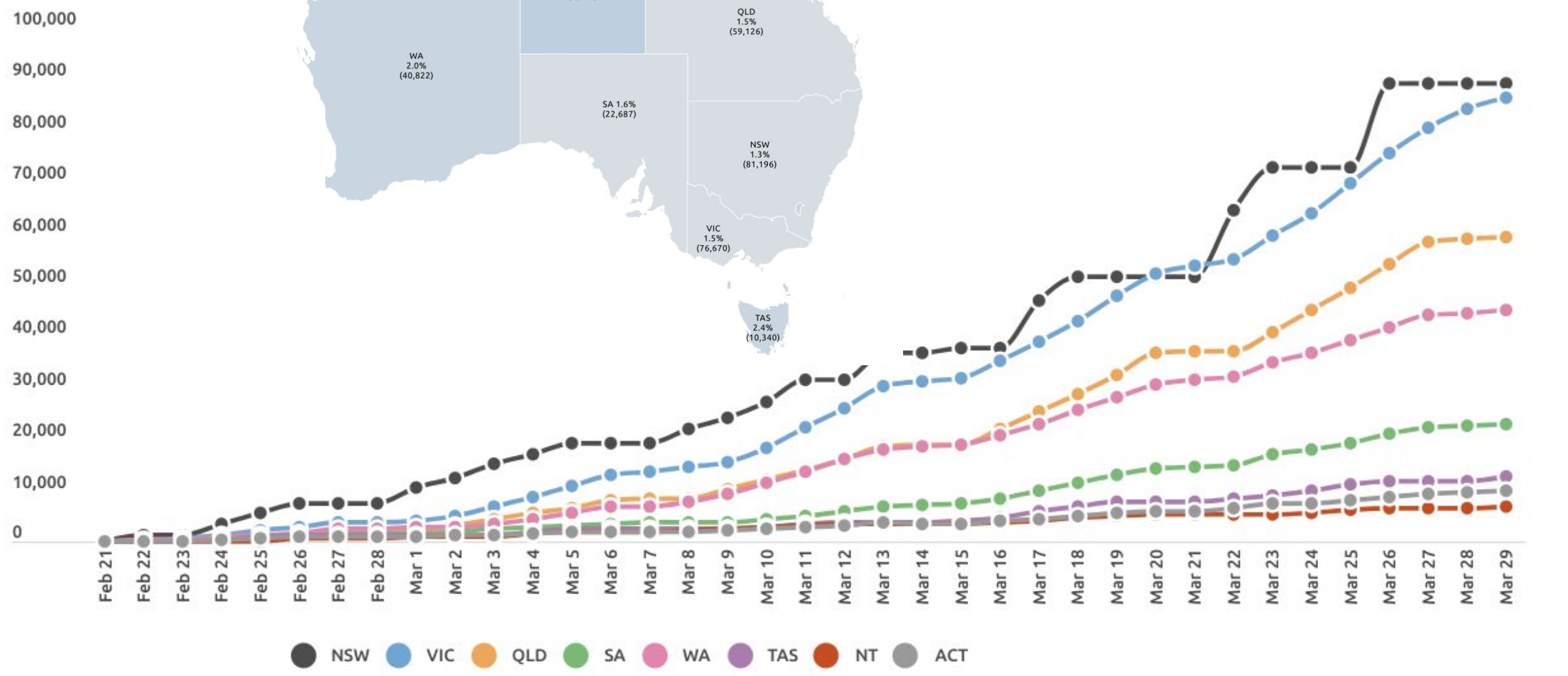
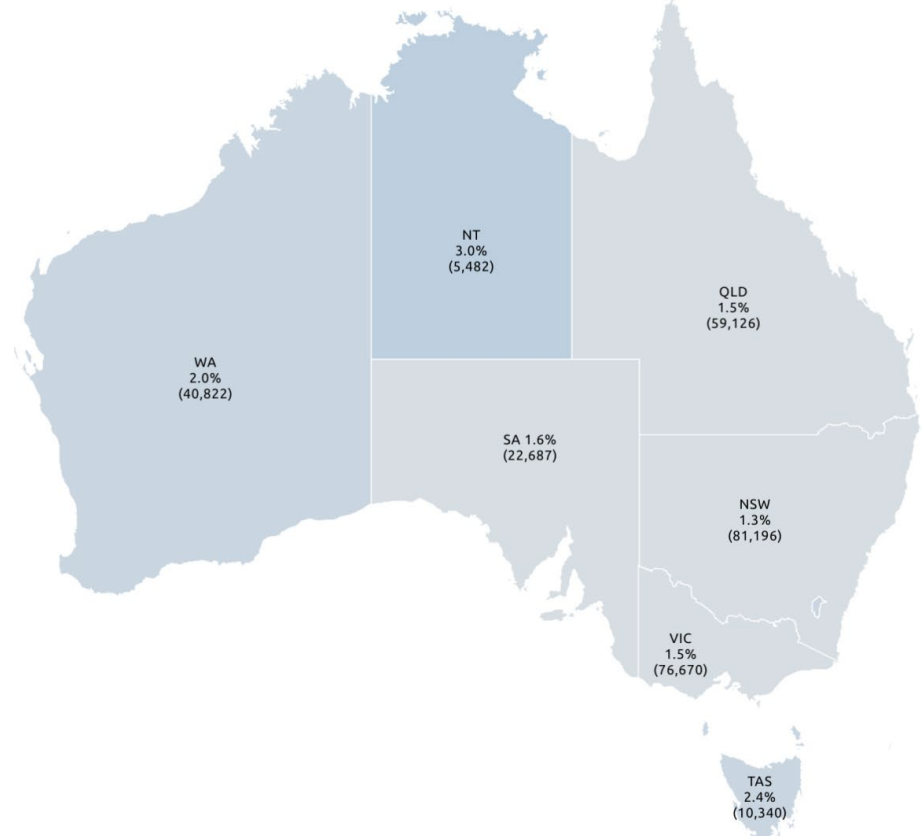

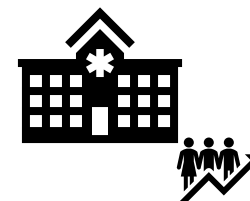

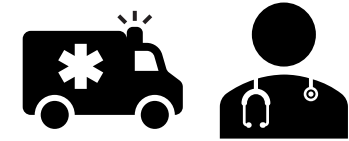

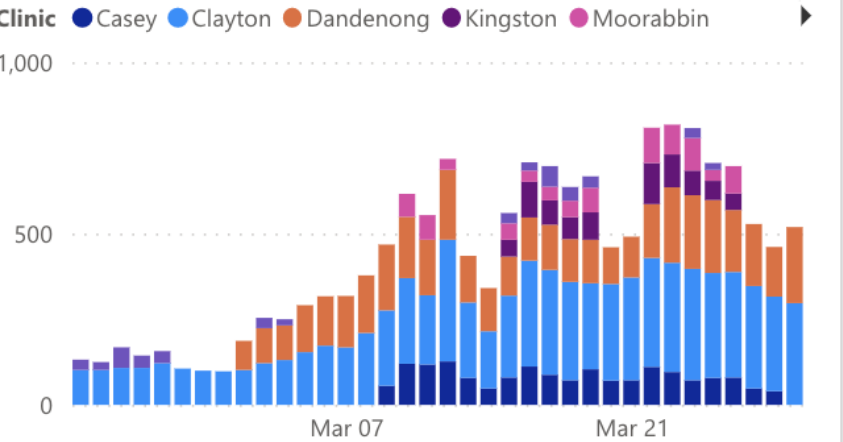

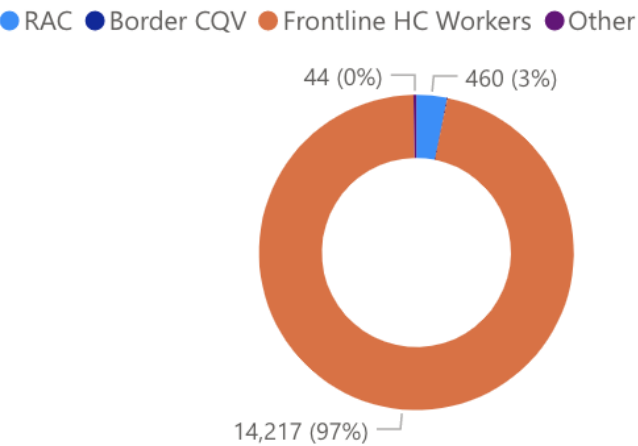

Vaccinations Daily Trend



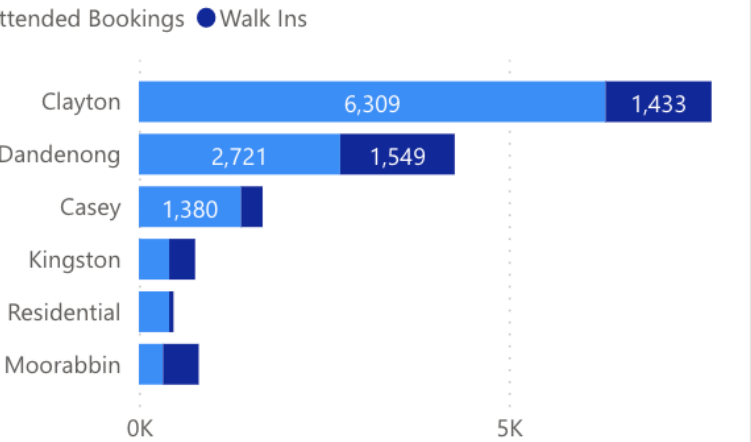

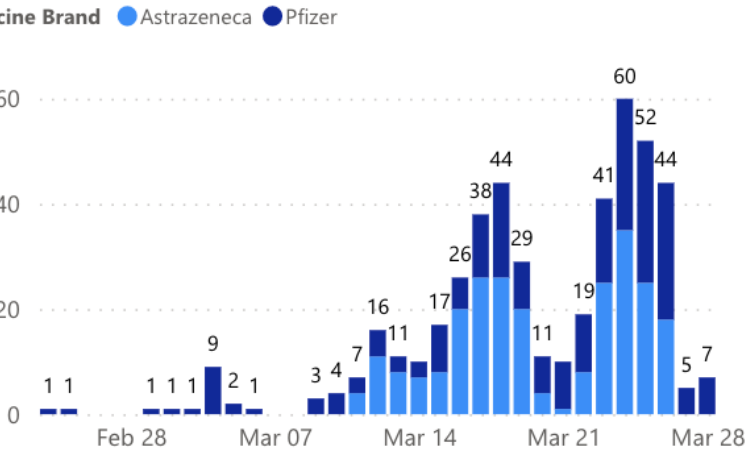

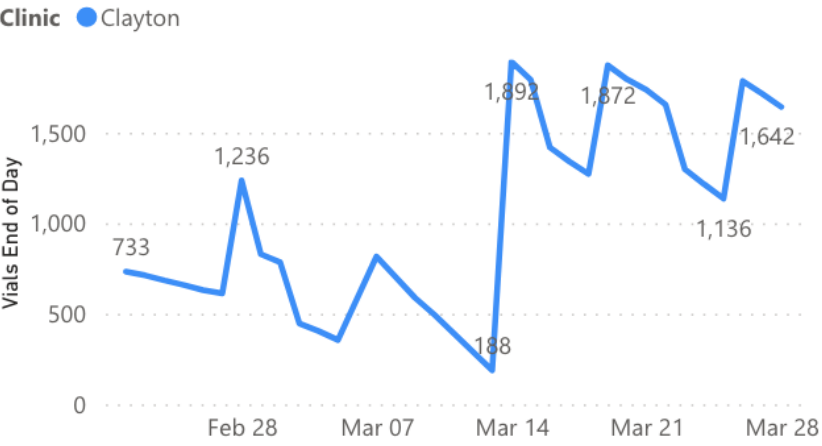

End of Day Vials Daily Trend



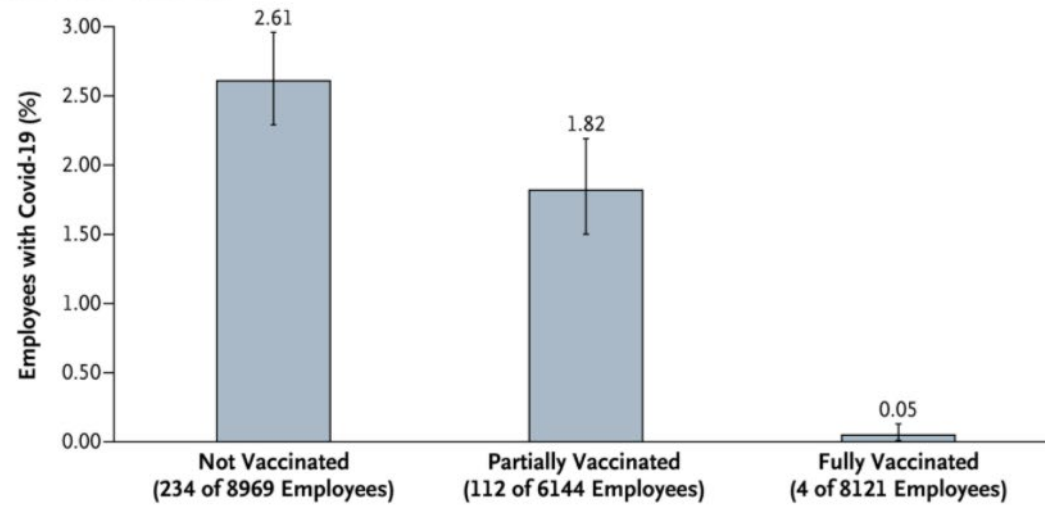

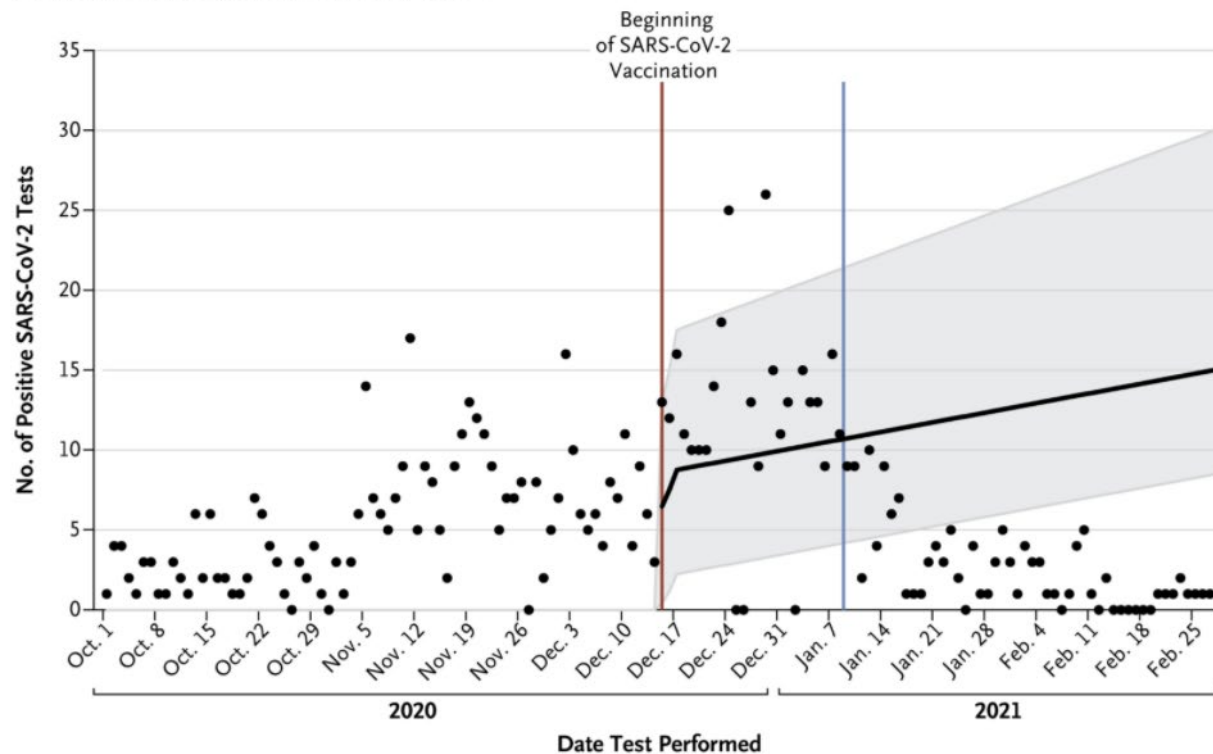

Allergies

Is AZ or Pfizer better if you have anaphylaxis?

**Only contraindication is anaphylaxis to the vaccine
or one of its components**

Past History of severe allergy – discuss with ID





Influenza vaccine

Best to have 2 weeks between COVID vaccine and other vaccines

Normal program commencing mid April

No need to book – information on sessions coming soon





Oxford AstraZeneca Vaccine

Safe and effective

Side effects post vaccination reflect intense immune response after 1st dose

Rare side effects reported outweighed by vaccine benefits
