- Approximately 1,500 births per year
- Level 3 Special Care Nursery with 8 cots
- Low complexity gynaecology services
  - Approximately 400-500 cases per year

### Background

Since 2013, The Royal Women's has provided obstetric, gynaecological and newborn care to Sandringham Hospital, in partnership with Alfred Health who manage and operate the Sandringham site.

Following the end of this relationship and extensive consultation, agreement has been reached for the transition of obstetric, gynaecological and newborn care to Monash Health Women's and Newborn from February 2023.

In total, 141 employees from the Women's @ Sandringham across the medical and midwifery, administration and health information workforce will transfer to Monash Health. There will be no loss of jobs, all the Women's @ Sandringham staff will remain covered by the same enterprise agreements, and all employee entitlements and length of service will be transferred to Monash Health

Monash Health providing these important services at Sandringham Hospital will ensure that the needs of the community are met by a health service that is connected to their local needs, along with a tertiary service closer to home.

Parents and parents-to-be in the Bayside region can be assured that Women's and Newborn services at Sandringham Hospital remain world-class, with ready access to tertiary care when needed.
