


Our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Population

- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander population comprises **10,359 persons** representing 0.6% of SEPHU's total population (2021), around **half of those live in the Monash Health catchment**
- Casey has the largest proportion of all SEPHU's Aboriginal population, with nearly a quarter residing in Casey



Aboriginal Hospital Liaison Officers (AHLOs)

Our AHLOs provide:

- Cultural, emotional and spiritual support to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander patients and their families during their inpatient stay at Monash Health.
- Participation in family meetings, goals of care and care planning.
- Patient advocacy and referrals to other services.
- Support in relation to discharge planning and linking to community services.

Eligibility Criteria

- Patients or families of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander backgrounds.
- No catchment or boundary restrictions.

Referrals

- Seven days a week, 8am 4:30pm
- Via EMR select "Referral to Aboriginal Health Service (Initial referral)".
 - Include referrer contact details and reason for referral, as well as any other relevant information.
